But, after graduation both general and honours students have equal opportunities to pursue further studies.


Programme Outcomes:

Course Outcomes :

Semester 1:

(PSc. 101: Political Theory)

1. The paper seeks to familiarize the fresh students of Political Science with the nature and relevance of Political Theory so as to make the students get a grasp on the ideas, concepts and theories in Political Theory.
2. The course provides a detailed treatment of various basic concepts of Political Theory like Democracy, Liberty, Equality, Law, Justice.

Semester 2:

(PSc. 202: Western Political Theory)

1. This paper examines the views of some of the most prominent Western Political philosophers starting with Plato and continuing till Marx, and how their responses to political issues profoundly affected the subsequent political thought.
2. The students will be able to understand, comprehend and evaluate the contributions of the great political thinkers and gain insight to problems and solutions offered by their great thinkers.

Semester 3:

(PSc. 303: Indian Government and Politics)

1. This paper will help students understand the socio-historical and religious background of the Indian Freedom Struggle. It also familiarizes them with the constitutional structure, centre-state relations.
2. The course also helps students understand the relation of religion with politics, nature of party system in India, political behaviour, caste and politics, and communalism, regionalism and national integration.

Semester 4:

(PSc. 404: Comparative Government and Politics)

1. This paper seeks to help the students to trace the nature, scope and methods of comparative politics and analyse the different approaches and models of comparison.

2. It also helps the students analyse critically and compare the different constitutions, features of a liberal democratic and socialist political system with focus on UK, USA, China, Japan and Switzerland.

Semester 5:

(PSc. 505: International Politics)

1. The students will learn about the nature, scope and major theoretical approaches to International Politics.
2. The understanding of Indian Foreign Policy and various determinants and shifts of it will help in developing the critical faculty of their mind to think and reflect on the political issues and phenomenon objectively.

(PSc. 606: Socialist Thought)

1. This paper seeks to familiarize the students and to examine the views of socialist thinkers like Robert Ovens, Charles Fourier, Marx, Engels, Lenin, Stalin and Mao.
2. The students will be able to understand, comprehend and critically evaluate the ideas of these thinkers and draw its relevance and contributions to the present political state.

PSc. 607: Public Administration

1. This paper seeks to familiarize the students with the broad overview of the discipline and acquaint with the meaning, nature, scope and significance; concepts, approaches and principles of public administration.
2. It also helps the students to analyse and understand the administrative theories and their relevant concepts so to make sense of administrative practices in a pragmatic way.

Semester 6:

(PSc. 608: Government and Politics of North-East India)

1. This paper offers the students to know about their own region, in terms of political growth and development.
2. The students will also be familiarized with the sixth schedule, formation of North-East states and the relation between the centre and the region.

(PSc. 609: Gandhian Studies)

1. This paper seeks to elaborate Gandhian thought and examine its practical implications. It will introduce students to Gandhi's thoughts and critically evaluate his legacy and relevance.
2. It will help students to understand the impact of Gandhian thought on Indian and Global politics.

Semester 6:

(PSc. 610: Indian Political Thought)

1. This paper helps the students to understand and analyse the Indian thinkers. The students will be able to understand their contribution to the discipline and have these ancient ideas still prove to be relevant in the present time.
2. Students will be able to explain the trajectory of ideas on key political questions and institutions of ancient India as developed by Manu and Keutilya. They will be able to understand Renaissance and Reformation in India and the role of R.R Roy, Vivekananda. They will be able to understand the ideas of nationalism of Aurobindo, Tilak and Gokhale. They will also come to know about the socialist ideas of MN Roy, J.P. Narayan and key ideas of Gandhi, Nehru, Ambedkar, Md. Iqbal, Subhaschandra Bose.
